

Aims

- Provide an academic and clinical environment for your professional growth into specialised cancer care
- Provide you with a broad knowledge base from which to plan and care for patients requiring cancer care

Duration

- 12 months duration commencing in February
- An option for mid-year intake is available in consultation with the Clinical Nurse Educator and Grampians Health Nursing and Midwifery Education Unit.
- Employment contract of 0.84 EFT for the duration of the course

Location

The Graduate Certificate in Cancer Nursing is offered at Ballarat, Stawell and Horsham.

Grampians Health oncology services

- Ballarat, Stawell and Horsham provide anti-cancer and supportive therapy
- Horsham and Stawell administer infusions required for chronic disease management
- Ballarat and Stawell offer radiation therapy services
- Home-based cancer care is also supported by specialist teams.

Theoretical Component

University of Melbourne provides the theoretical component of the course. Grampians Health provides a strong link supporting your theoretical knowledge in the clinical setting.

Clinical Component

The clinical component of the course is undertaken in the Grampians Health cancer care areas.

The Clinical Nurse Educator provides structured clinical tutorials, bedside clinical teaching and progressive, dynamic assessment methods for you to achieve clinical performance.

Clinical Support and Assessments

The role of the Clinical Nurse Educator – Oncology is to support, mentor and facilitate the student's clinical program and educational development.

Formal clinical appraisal and assessment of competency skills are undertaken throughout the course in accordance with University guidelines. Clinical assessments focus on the acquisition, understanding and demonstration of clinical skills in specialised areas of cancer care.

Application Process

- Applications must be made directly to Grampians Health at www.gh.org.au/careers
- Once a position is secured, an application can be lodged with University of Melbourne

Application Requirements

- Registered Nurse with AHPRA
- Minimum 12 months recent post-registration acute general nursing experience
- Minimum 6 months in area of study (Oncology)

Selection Criteria

- · Meets University selection criteria
- Meets medical, immunisation, police and working with children criteria
- Satisfactory interview
- · Satisfactory clinical references
