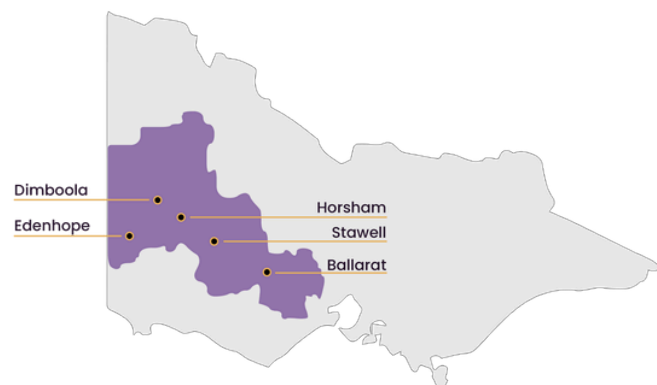

Location

The Graduate Certificate in Renal Nursing is available at our Ballarat and Horsham campuses.

Grampians Health Dialysis Unit

Haemodialysis services are available at our Ballarat and Horsham campuses. Each unit operates six days a week to provide both outpatient and inpatient treatments for patients with end-stage kidney disease.

Theoretical Component

University of Tasmania provides the theoretical component of the course online. It is completed in one academic year.

Grampians Health provides a strong supportive link challenging your theoretical knowledge in the clinical setting.

Clinical Component

The clinical component of the course is undertaken in the Grampians Health Dialysis Units. The Clinical Nurse Educator provides structured clinical tutorials and bedside clinical teaching to enhance clinical learning and performance.

Clinical Support and Assessments

Clinical supervision is provided by the Clinical Nurse Educator – Renal. The educator's role is to support, mentor and facilitate the student's clinical program and educational development. Study days are organised throughout the year to enhance the theory provided by the University of Tasmania.

Formal assessment is undertaken throughout the course by University of Tasmania.

Application Process

- Applicants require current nursing employment within Grampians Health, preferably in a renal area, and have the support of the Nurse Unit Manager

Application Requirements

- Registered Nurse with AHPRA
- Minimum 12 months recent post-registration acute general nursing experience
- Minimum 6 months in area of study (renal)

Selection Criteria

- Meets University selection criteria
- Meets medical, immunisation, police and working with children criteria
- Holds employment in Haemodialysis within Grampians Health
