POSITION PURPOSE

This medical oncology fellow position provides comprehensive training based at the Ballarat Regional Integrated Cancer Centre (BRICC) combining clinical practice with research experience. The fellow will develop broad expertise across multiple tumour streams through diverse clinical settings while maintaining a strong research focus. The position is conducted under the supportive supervision of an experienced

consultant team of five full-time and five visiting medical oncologists. These diverse clinical settings provide broad exposure to patient management, complex case discussion, and collaborative treatment planning. This dual clinical-research focus provides a strong foundation for career development in academic oncology and specialist oncology practice.

The position involves attending oncology clinics four days per week, including potential participation in weekly regional outreach clinics, and engaging in consultant-led ward rounds three times weekly.

About Ballarat Regional Integrated Cancer Centre (BRICC):

The Ballarat Regional Integrated Cancer Centre (BRICC) is a comprehensive regional cancer service housed within a purpose-built facility. The centre offers a complete range of oncological services, including an outpatient chemotherapy unit, at-home cancer services, two linear accelerators for radiotherapy, a dedicated inpatient oncology unit, and an established and rapidly expanding clinical trials unit. The service benefits from comprehensive allied health support, including specialised cancer coordinators and nurses (breast cancer, melanoma, prostate cancer, and general cancer nurses; lung and bowel cancer coordinators), oncology pharmacy services, physiotherapy, exercise physiotherapy, speech pathology, dietetics, occupational therapy, and social work services. The medical oncology service operates within a structured multidisciplinary framework, serving a catchment population exceeding 350,000 patients across the Grampians Health network. The department maintains close working relationships with all clinical departments within Ballarat Base Hospital and provides oncological expertise throughout the region, including outreach clinics and treatment services at regional centres. Collaborative relationships exist with the co-located radiation oncology service and nearby Gandarra Palliative Care Facility, as well as with metropolitan institutions including Austin Health.

KEY ACCOUNTABILITIES

Clinical Excellence & Service Delivery

- Provide comprehensive, evidence-based outpatient care to Medical Oncology patients at BRICC as well as regional outreach sites to ensure equitable access across the Grampians Health network. The position involves attending oncology clinics four days per week, including potential participation in weekly regional outreach clinics, and engaging in consultant-led ward rounds three times weekly.
- Provide clinical coverage for inpatient duties, particularly during periods of leave for the Medical Oncology Advanced Trainee.
- Actively participate in the medical oncology after-hours, weekend, and public holiday rosters as required.
- Actively participate in the tumour specific multidisciplinary team (MDT) meetings.
- Contribute to the strategic enhancement and development of the Medical Oncology service at Grampians Health.

Research & Clinical Trials

- Actively participate in Phase 1–3 clinical trials across various tumour streams, including attendance at feasibility meetings, protocol reviews, and safety monitoring to ensure study requirements are met.
- Work closely with the Clinical Trials Unit to support operations through patient screening, recruitment, informed consent, and accurate completion of all trial documentation.
- Monitor and report adverse events and safety concerns in a timely manner to ensure regulatory compliance and patient safety
- Maintain data integrity and ensure adherence to GCP/ICH guidelines and regulatory requirements
- Develop and execute a supervised research project under mentor guidance, with the goal of publication or presentation at regional, national, or international oncology meetings

- Foster collaborative research relationships with metropolitan partners (e.g., Austin Hospital) and other regional institutions.

Academic and Professional Development

- Attend the weekly Victorian Medical Oncology Training Group (VMOTG) education series in Melbourne, with dedicated protected time provided to facilitate attendance.
- Participate regularly in unit-based educational activities, including Journal Club and Mortality and Morbidity (M&M) meetings, to support evidence-based practice and quality improvement.
- Participate in regional, national, and international oncology conferences, subject to approval from the Head of Medical Oncology.

Teaching, Leadership & Mentorship

- Actively contribute to the clinical supervision, mentorship, and professional development of Medical Oncology Advanced Trainees, Basic Physician Trainees (BPTs), Hospital Medical Officers (HMOs), and medical students
- Participate in the teaching and training of RACP exam candidates.
- Contribute to a collaborative team environment and provide formal/informal mentorship to junior colleagues.

Quality, Safety & Risk management

- Strict compliance with all Grampians Health (GH) Policies and Procedures, including Infection Control and Health & Safety protocols.
- Participate in GH integrated risk management systems by identifying, minimizing, and managing risks and seeking opportunities for continuous improvement.

Minimum Qualifications & Experience

- MBBS or equivalent degree.
- Current Registration with the Medical Board of Australia (AHPRA).
- Successful completion of both RACP Written and Clinical Examinations.
- Either fully or partly completed advanced training in medical oncology.
- Minimum of 3 years post-graduate experience (PGY3+), with clinical competency consistent with a Senior Registrar level.
- Excellent communication and the ability to work effectively within a multidisciplinary team.

Desirable:

- Specialist registration or eligibility for specialist registration (FRACP).
- Demonstrated commitment to oncology patient care and research activities.
- Active registration with the Royal Australasian College of Physicians.

Experience:

- Clinical experience consistent with stage of career.
- Experience in self-management and organization of work to achieve agreed outcomes.
