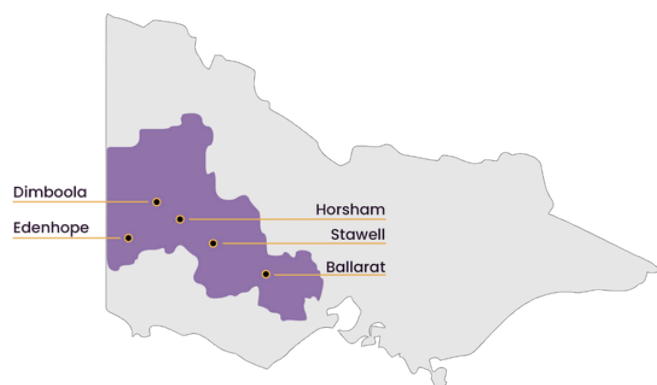

Our Special Care Nursery at Ballarat is a level 4 unit, that provides holistic care to newborns born after 32 weeks and are admitted directly from the postnatal ward or the emergency department.

Theoretical Component

Federation University provides the theoretical component of the course online. It is completed in one academic year. Grampians Health provides a strong link supporting your theoretical knowledge in the clinical setting.

Clinical Component

The clinical component of the course is undertaken in the Grampians Health Special Care Nursery.

The Clinical Nurse Educator provides structured clinical tutorials and bedside clinical teaching to enhance clinical learning and performance.

Clinical Support and Assessments

Clinical supervision is provided by the Clinical Nurse Educator – Paediatrics. The Educator's role is to support, mentor and facilitate the student's clinical program and educational development.

Study days are organised throughout the year to enhance the theory provided by Federation University. Formal assessment is undertaken throughout the course by Federation University.

Application Process

- Applicants require current nursing employment within Grampians Health, preferably in the Special Care Nursery.

Application Requirements

- Registered Nurse with AHPRA
- Minimum 12 months recent post-registration acute general nursing experience
- Minimum 6 months recent acute neonatal nursing experience

- Meets medical, immunisation, police and working with children criteria
- Holds employment in Special Care Nursery at Grampians Health
